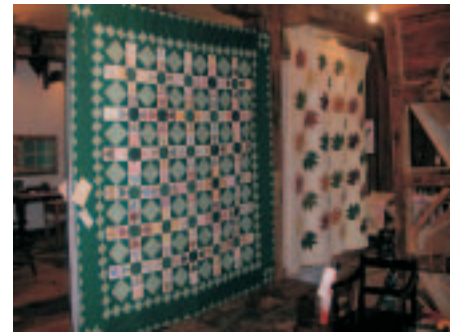


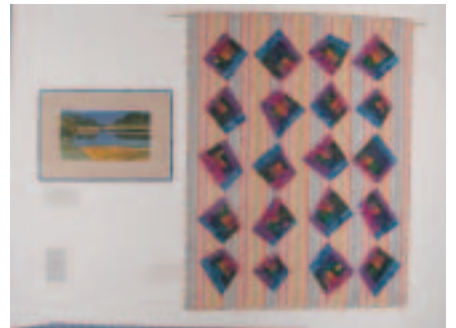
Paisley Quilt Show 2006

There were 68 displayed quilts and 46 for sale for a total of 104. This exhibit has grown to be one of the major quilt shows in the province in just 2 short years. Well over 500 visitors came to Nature's MillWorks to view the one week display

The quilt on the left is by Susan Rankin containing poetry lullabies, the one on the right is by Mike Taylor in memory of her mother and is her first quilt.



These are miniature quilts by Bev White. A significant cross Canada display of these were on exhibit at the Southampton Museum at the same time as this show.



This quilt by Eileen Brown was a competitive quilt and won Paisley Fall Fair, and Bruce County but did not quite make it at the provincial level.



On the left shows 3 quilts. On the wall is a centenary quilt, at the headboard is a "pineapple quilt done in velour dated 1883 from Myrna Inglis, at the foot board is a 1929 Port Elgin Presbyterian Church signature quilt. On the right shows the patterns used as directions for the underground railroad.
